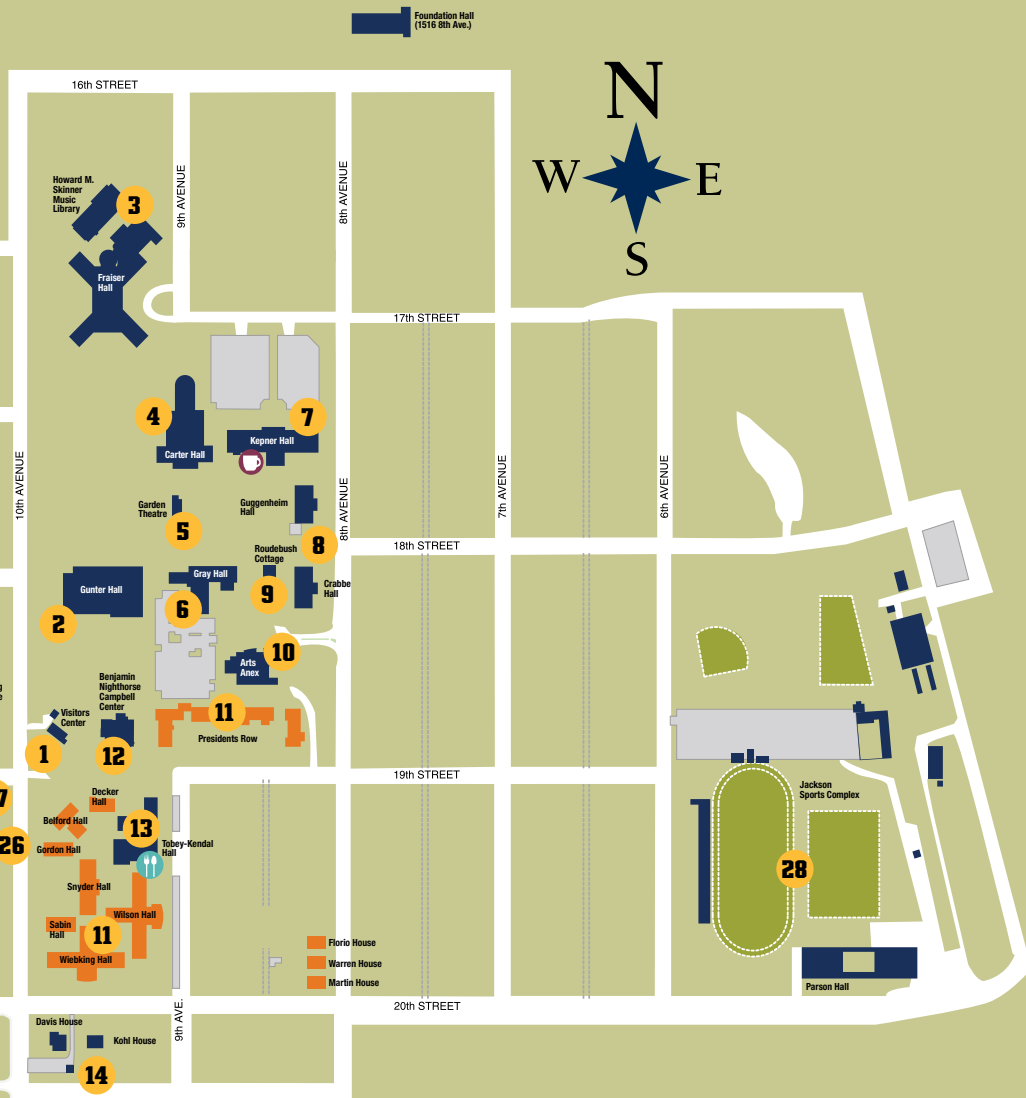
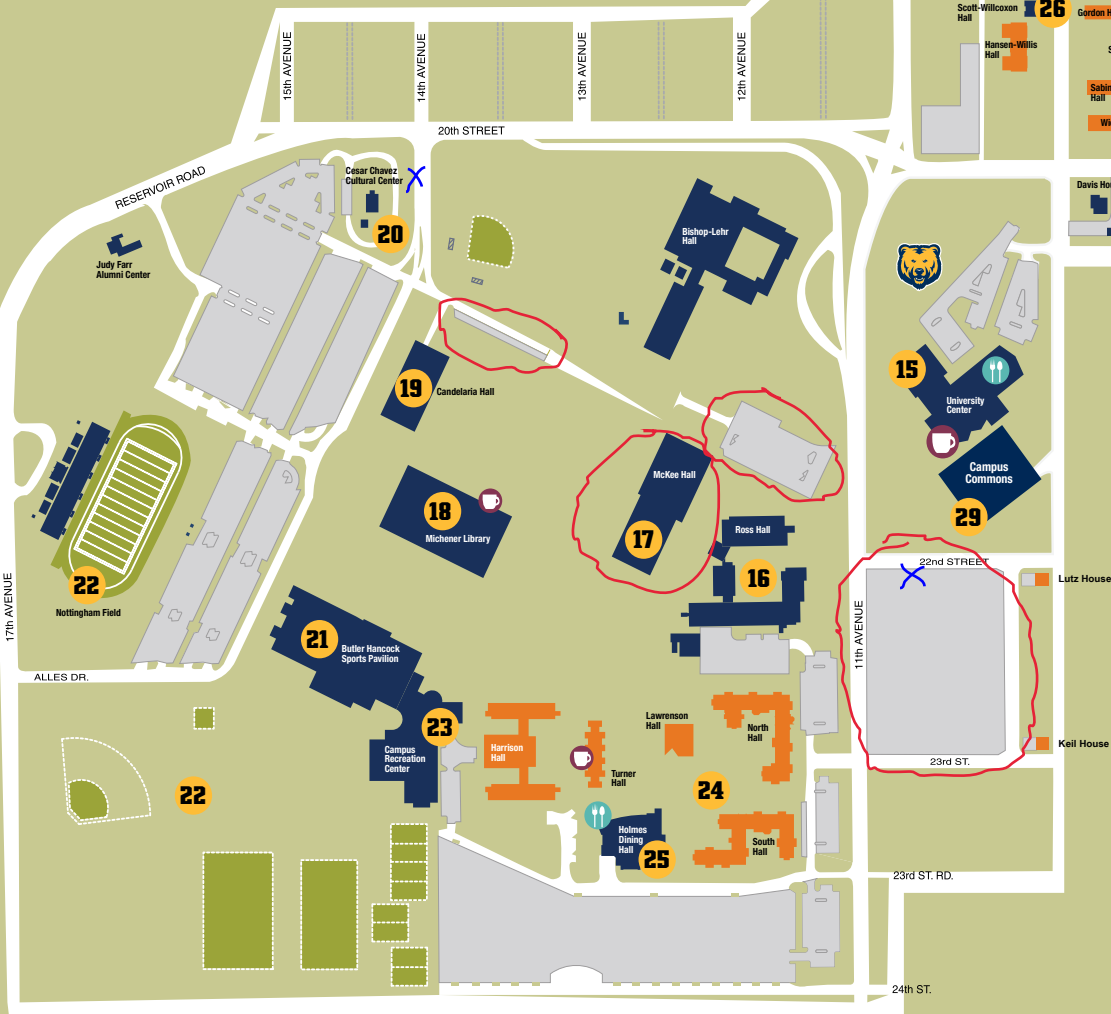


CAMPUS MAP KEY

UNC has a rich history of education, first being called the State Normal School and then the Colorado State Teacher’s College, where future teachers received their education. Since then, the university has expanded and become a renowned institution in many diverse areas in addition to teacher education.

The University of Northern Colorado welcomes you to our beautiful and diverse campus. And, it isn't just that our students come from all 50 states and from 37 different countries; UNC has nearly 250 different types of trees on campus and buildings in an assortment of architectural styles and interesting amenities.



1 Visitors Center 4F

The Visitors Center is home to the UNC Office of Admissions and is a great place to start your tour. It was formerly the UNC President's Residence, but it was converted in 1999 to be a place for prospective students to learn about UNC and attend admissions events and tours.

4 Carter Hall 2F

This former library is presently dedicated to administrative offices such as the Graduate School, The Office of Financial Aid, the Registrar and International Admissions. Outside the west doors sits the cornerstone of Cranford Hall, the first UNC building, constructed in 1890.

2 Gunter Hall 3F

Gunter Hall was originally designed to be UNC's athletics building. However, this iconic structure is a hive of academic activity during the school year. Most of the Natural and Health Sciences programs, including Sport and Exercise Science, Nursing and Speech Language Pathology, all assemble here to learn about and advance understanding of the human condition. The bell tower tolls every quarter hour, ensuring that nappers on the green make it to class on time.

3 Frasier Hall and Skinner Music Library 1-2F

Skinner Music Library has more than 100,000 music scores as well as books and periodicals on its shelves. Frasier Hall is UNC's own labyrinth of music and theatre arts classrooms and performance spaces.

5 Garden Theatre 3F

UNC's outdoor stage hosts many events each year, including concerts, dancing, and gatherings.

6 Gray Hall 3G

Parking Services, the UNC Police Department and Norton Theatre are the primary occupants of Gray Hall today. Gray Hall was once home to a pub called the Bru-Inn. Norton Theatre now fills that space and hosts the Little Theatre of the Rockies.

7 Kepner Hall 2G

This unique red brick building used to be a K-12 school in the 1920's. Now renovated, the prestigious Monfort College of Business fills its halls. It is the first and only business school to receive the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award from the Office of the President of the United States and is also accredited by the AACSB in

accounting and business administration. Many of the classrooms are equipped with SMART technology and there is also a Coffee Corner in the lower level.

8 Guggenheim and Crabbe Hall 3G

These sister buildings are creation spaces for many Visual Arts majors at UNC. There are two recently renovated dance studios located in Crabbe for Performing Arts students. Guggenheim and Crabbe are long-standing testaments of UNC's devotion to the arts on campus.

9 Roudebush Cottage 3G

Veterans Services occupies the Roudebush cottage. Resources for veteran and military-affiliated students, advising for those under the GI Bill, and the headquarters for the Student Veterans of America UNC affiliate are a part of Veterans Services.

10 Arts Annex 4G

Photographers, sculptors, jewelry makers and ceramists all have the opportunity to be creative in this space. This building is a haven for Visual Arts students complete with a 20 station digital darkroom and two SMART classrooms.

11 Central Campus Housing 5F

Central campus is known for its beauty, green spaces and charm. The residence halls here accommodate more than one thousand students and provide close access to Tobey-Kendel Dining Hall and the Student Health and Counseling Centers.

12 Ben Nighthorse Campbell Center 4F

University of Northern Colorado Cancer Rehabilitation Institute (UNCCRI) mission is to relieve suffering, promote self-sufficiency, and eliminate secondary cancers and recurrences to improve the quality of life of cancer survivors through prescriptive exercise and nutrition education. UNCCRI, housed in the Ben Nighthorse Campbell Center, is recognized nationally as a leading facility in cancer rehabilitation.

13 Tobey-Kendel Hall 5F

Tobey-Kendel, known simply as T-K to students, is one of three dining locations on campus. The offices of Housing and Residential Education and Dining Services are also located here and are happy to answer questions about living and eating at UNC.


14 Kohl and Davis Houses 6F

These two houses are multicultural centers. Each has its own lounge and study areas. The Marcus Garvey Center for Black Cultural Education is in the Davis House and both the Asian/Pacific American Student Services (A/PASS) and Native American Student Services (NASS) are located in the Kohl House as well as a resource library and computer lab.

15 University Center 7E

The UC is the hub of daily activity on campus. Its hilltop location links west and central campuses. The university bookstore, Zachariah's food court, Beso Campus Salon, and several retail dining locations are located here as well as several offices such as Dining, the Center for International Education and also Student Leadership. To the North of the University Center stands a bronze bear statue known as "Northern Vision" as indicated on the map with . It's a great place for a photo!

16 Ross Hall 8D

One of the newest academic buildings on campus, Ross Hall is equipped with many state-of-the-art laboratories and multi-media classrooms for faculty and undergraduate and graduate student research and science education. Inside Ross is a campus hotspot: a bust of former President Ross, whose bald head students rub for luck in exams. However, real educational magic happens in the mathematics and English tutoring centers also located in Ross.

17 McKee Hall 7D

Primarily, McKee Hall is known for being the core of the teacher education institute here at UNC, but actually many programs collaborate here including the Psychology and Philosophy departments.

18 Michener Library 7C

Our library is named for renowned UNC alumnus and Pulitzer Prize winning author James A. Michener. Michener is the largest building on campus, with 17 miles of full bookshelves and countless study spaces. It also offers students many services such as Academic Support and Advising, Disability Support Services and the Center for Honors, Scholars and Leadership.

19 Candelaria Hall 7C

Candelaria Hall is filled to the brim with culture by the College of Humanities and Social Sciences. Many of UNC's language labs and computer stations are here and Bears News also operates out of Candelaria, where they broadcast on the radio as well as on the UNC website.

20 César Chávez Cultural Center 6B

Located in the Patton House, the César Chávez Cultural Center can help you connect with other students, learn about UNC resources and find out about Latino and Latina organizations on campus.

21 Butler Hancock Sports Pavilion and Bank of Colorado Arena 8B

With its seating capacity of 3,000, intercollegiate athletics, concerts, and philanthropic events are all hosted in Butler Hancock. The building includes a field house, training facility and athletics offices.

24 West Campus Housing 9D

West campus features some of the larger residence halls, able to accommodate more than 2,000 students with convenient access to Holmes Dining Hall, Michener Library and the Campus Rec Center. West campus residents enjoy up-to-date amenities with some of the best views on campus. The Outdoor Pursuits program is located in Harrison Hall; here students can rent equipment for various outdoor adventures like skiing and camping at no cost.

25 Holmes Dining Hall 9D

The newest of UNC's dining facilities, Holmes Hall can hold five hundred and fifty students comfortably. Many special events and culinary demonstrations are held here throughout the year.

26 Scott-Wilcoxon Hall 5E

The Women's Resource Center and the Stryker Institute for Leadership Development are in Scott-Wilcoxon to provide materials, programs and discussions about women's issues, celebrate the achievements of women and raise awareness on the status of women everywhere.

27 Cassidy Hall 5E

Registered nurses, counselors, nurse practitioners and physicians all work in here to keep Bears healthy. The Student Health Center, the University Counseling Center, and the Assault Survivors Advocacy Program are all in Cassidy Hall.

28 Jackson Sports Complex 5I

Located just a few blocks from the main campus, Jackson Field is comprised of the UNC Ropes Course, a soccer field, a baseball field, and the practice space for the Pride of the Rockies Marching Band.

29 Campus Commons 7 E

The Campus Commons, opening in early 2019 , will serve as a gateway from the community to UNC. Admissions, Alumni Relations, a musical performance hall and a café will all be located in the Commons, along with GPS+, an office designed as a central hub for current students. GPS+ is a central location for student finances, career counseling, major exploration, study abroad and other student services.
