RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES

All candidates complete a capstone research project, oncampus clinic rotations and a three-semester externship; the average time to graduation is less than four years.

CERTIFICATIONS

Graduates are eligible to apply for the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Audiology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and/or for Board Certification in Audiology awarded by the American Board of Audiology. Since 2010, program graduates have experienced a 100 percent employment rate.

- Dedicated faculty members have research interest and experience in areas including cochlear implants, aural rehabilitation and hearing aids, prevention of noise-induced hearing loss, otoacoustic emissions and balance disorders.
