Cost and Value

Tuition rates are based on the 2021-22 Academic Year:

Colorado Resident Tuition: M.A. and Ed.S., \$633; Ed.D., \$685 per credit hour, plus fees.

Nonresident Tuition: M.A. and Ed.S., \$1,185; Ed.D., \$1,296 per credit hour plus fees.

Extended Campus: M.A. and Ed.S., \$618; Ed.D., \$659 per credit hour.
