teaching, the effectiveness of instructional interventions and the social psychology of learning organizations. At UNC, you'll find flexible degree options in Educational Psychology. Courses are designed to help you grow your professional abilities and advance your career, with classes led by award-winning faculty with extensive research experience. You'll also have many diverse and valuable opportunities to pursue your own research, learn in the field and participate in graduate student organizations such as the Educational Psychology Society.

A master's degree in Educational Psychology is valuable for a diverse population including teachers seeking to develop their own philosophy of instruction and students' learning, individuals interested in researching human learning and motivation, consultants wishing to develop expertise in occupational learning and persons seeking employment in school districts, departments of education or other education related organizations.

Molly Jameson, Ph.D.

Molly M. Jameson, Ph.D., is an educational psychologist who researches the development of math anxiety in primary grades children and adult learners. She published the first developmentally-appropriate scale to assess math anxiety in young children, which has been translated to seven languages, is in use by government agencies and school districts and is currently being piloted in franchised math-tutoring centers in North America. Jameson is also an award-winning educator whose focus on teaching and learning promotes meaningful connections between course content and real-world application.
