Designed specifically for teachers, the Master of Arts in Foreign Languages — Spanish Teaching Emphasis program can be completed over three summers at UNC's main campus in Greeley, Colorado. Your training will include intensive

language-immersion workshops, often with the expertise of nationally known guest lecturers in addition to our award-winning faculty to guide you. You'll learn from native speakers, working in small classes that offer rewarding levels of interaction and mentorship, with many opportunities to apply your learning in the field, through classroom research, writing for the *Confluencia* journal and the option to take part in a summer study abroad experience in Salamanca, Spain.

When you earn your M.A. in Foreign Languages — Spanish Teaching Emphasis you will be prepared to work in a variety of learning contexts, including K-12 or higher education (community college or university level). Specific career opportunities include:

Study Abroad: During the Spanish Peninsular rotation, up to nine hours of course work may be completed during a summer study abroad experience in Salamanca, Spain. # **Faculty Spotlight**

#### Efrain Garza, Ph.D.

Dr. Efraín E. Garza earned a bachelor's degree in Spanish and Bilingual Education at the University of Texas at Brownsville in 1992. He subsequently received a master's degree in Romance Languages in 1994 and a doctoral degree in Spanish Literature from Texas Tech University in 1997. At the present time he is a Professor of Spanish in the Department of Hispanic Studies at UNC. He is author of Las leyendas de Bécquer y su aproximación al simbolismo francés, La reivindicación de los derechos de la mujer en diez cuentos de Emilia Pardo Bazán y Las manifestaciones del amor en los cuentos de Pardo Bazán. Dr. Garza is the editor of El naturalismo en España: aproximaciones desde una perspectiva actual. As a product of his lyrical interest, Editorial Verbum published his first collection of poems Acuarela de la vida, Watercolor of life in 2003. His second poetry book is Sueños más allá de la frontera.
