If you want to make a difference in the lives of those with disabilities, UNC's Rehabilitation Counseling program will provide you with the education and training to join a rapidly growing field. Ranked among the best in the nation by U.S. News and World Report, our program is accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs and the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) and known for its exceptional teachers who are also experts and seasoned

researchers in the field. Small class sizes and the opportunity for one-on-one mentoring and supervision are two of the aspects of our program that contribute to student success. Our students participate in supervised practicum and an off-campus internship with a community service agency, as well as participate in weekly supervision sessions and professional development activities. This experience provides our students with an opportunity to apply the theoretical concepts and skills learned in their academic program and supplements that knowledge with practical experience.

Career Pathway

Employment of rehabilitation counselors is projected to grow 20 percent from 2012 to 2022. UNC's graduates have historically been avidly recruited regionally and nationally. For the three-year academic period (2010-2013), UNC students had a 100 percent employment rate. Rehabilitation counselors have found employment in the following industries:

Degree Options

Designed to meet the needs of working professionals, about half of our required courses are completed online, with the other half offered on campus in the late afternoon and evening. Students have completed internship activities at the Colorado Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Veterans Administration and Bayaud Enterprises, to name a few.
