Degree Options

Applied Behavior Analysis Emphasis

The optional ABA emphasis in the Ed.S. program integrates a Behavior Analyst Certification Board® (BACB©)-approved sequence. The Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) emphasis is designed for students who wish to become school psychologist practitioners with specialized knowledge and skills in applied behavior analysis. The emphasis satisfies the coursework requirements for BCBA Certification.
