We offer the only APA-accredited* School Psychology Ph.D. program in Colorado, and currently one of less than 100 in the U.S. For our graduates, this means a competitive edge in the job market, eligibility for licensure and academic positions. The Ph.D. program is also approved by the National Association of School Psychologists. At UNC we emphasize both science and practice, teaching students to conduct research and apply existing research to the practice of psychology.
