working with clients in our on-site Social Research Lab – UNC's fully-funded, live action research center. Skills emphasized in this program include interpreting and analyzing data to address social problems from a sociological perspective. The general focus of this program allows students to cultivate marketable skills to a variety of jobs and industries.

Career Pathway

Our students include individuals currently working, or interested in working, in both public and private service agencies as well as those interested in pursuing a Ph.D.

The work you do on your internship and/ or research project will prepare you for a position in a non-profit or government organization. In addition to pursuing further academic work, graduates find placement in various human service organizations dealing with families and children, the aged, crime and justice, community planning, housing, domestic violence and social policy research.

Degree Options

Choose to specialize your degree with two emphasis options. The applied emphasis culminates in a professional research report based on the research internship experience and is intended for students with a passion for advocacy who want a career outside of academia. The thesis emphasis culminates in a thesis research project and is intended for students who want to pursue further research or teach at the college level.

Financing your Education

UNC offers a variety of financial support options, including:

- The sociology program offers a limited number of competitive teaching and research assistantships. Each assistantship offers 50 percent funding (covering tuition and offering a stipend).
