TURABIAN HEADING FORMAT: A Manual for Writers of Research Papers, Theses, and Dissertations, Ninth Edition (Same for Chicago Manual of Style author. DO NOT add extra space between chapter number, title, and between paragraphs/headings.

CHAPTER I

CHAPTER TITLE CENTERED IN FULL CAPS

First-Level Heading: Centered Upper and Lower-Case, Bold Font

Second-Level Heading: Centered Upper and Lower-case, Use Plain Font or Italics

Third-Level Flush Left Heading in Bold Font, Upper and Lower-Case

Fourth-Level Flush Left Heading, Upper and Lower-Case, Plain or Italics

Fifth-level, bold font, paragraph indent ending in a period, sentence case. The paragraph continues on the same line as the heading. This heading is not adjusted if it's longer than any length
