Campus Rec Advisory Board (CRAB)

The GSA has appointed Alicia Romero (SES: Sport Administration, Ph.D. student) as our representative on this board. CRAB has been out of service for the past year, but we are wanting to get it running again so graduate student concerns / suggestions can be discussed with Campus Rec administration.

What Grad Council Members Can Do:

Graduate Student Employment

Graduate students can have other employment while also holding a graduate assistantship. From the Graduate TA Handbook:

You may not hold regular full-time employment while holding an appointment as an assistant. Full-time employees of UNC may not hold an assistantship. Those with a dependent tuition waiver may not hold an assistantship at the same time. Instead, you must choose between the assistantship and the dependent tuition waiver.

Because being both a graduate student and a graduate assistant will occupy most of your time, we do not recommend that you hold any outside employment during your assistantship.

Nevertheless, we do not prohibit you from holding part-time off-campus employment — which in no event may exceed 20 hours a week. It is up to you to determine how much time, if any, you can devote to additional activities and still make progress toward your degree and fulfill your responsibilities as a graduate assistant. Programs or units do have the discretionary right, however, to make appointments to students whose level of commitment suggests that they will be most likely to attain their educational goals while maintaining their graduate assistant responsibilities.

The assistantship policies do not prohibit students from working fulltime in another job during Thanksgiving Break, Spring Break, Winter Break, and the summer. International students, due to their visa status, are not allowed to work more than the 20 hours per week required for their assistantship while school is in session. International students may be eligible to work full-time in other positions while school is not in session – please contact the Center of International Education for more information.

What Grad Council Members Can Do:

Please let your students know that holding a graduate assistantship does not preclude them from parttime employment. Health insurance is a recurring topic of discussion at GSA meetings. The annual premium for a single student on UNC's Student Health Insurance Plan is \$3,552.00 (August 17, 2020 – August 17, 2021). Eligible students can save money by signing up for Colorado Medicaid or purchasing health insurance through the Healthcare.gov marketplace.

What Grad Council Members Can Do:

Let your students know that they are not required to use UNC's Student Health Insurance if they can find sufficient medical coverage through Colorado Medicaid or other health insurance plan.
