Honors Program Curriculum Overview

First Year Honors Experience

Should be completed 1st year. May be completed in 2nd year.

- Attend the Honors Retreat (September 13, 12:30 PM 5:00 PM)
- In FALL 2025: Complete one Honors course option: HON100, HON180, HON185, LEAD100, UNIV101 or ENG122-011 (Only this section of ENG122 counts)
- In Spring 2026: Complete any HON seminar course offered in Spring.
- Participate in the Honors Connect Co-Curricular requirement
 - Minimum of 5 Honors Connect Co-Curricular Credits over the year to complete First Year Honors.
 - o Each semester: 10 Honors Connect Co-Curricular Credits gives you Priority Enrollment for next term.
- Attend our Honors Banquet May 3, 2026.
- First Year Honors designation on Transcript

University Honors Program

Completed over 2 to 4 years.

- **Students from First year Honors Experience** may continue on into University Honors Program and complete the program. The 6 credits from First Year Experience applies toward University Honors Program.
- 12 credits of Honors seminars &/or applied learning courses any of the following:
 - <u>Up to 6</u> credits lower division honors or leadership courses
 - can be from First Year Honors Experience
 - HON395: Special Topics courses (one or two offered each semester)
 - Internships/Practicums/Student Teaching (includes nursing practicum)
 - Includes courses from the major/may double dip.
 - Study Abroad including short term, full semester, summer programs, etc.
 - Honors offers a short term (Spring Break) study abroad course in Spring.
 - Research Courses (includes PSY201; CRJ380; BIO422 etc.)
 - Includes courses from the major/may double dip
- 4 credits Honors Capstone –CAN double dip with a major based capstone experience.
 - o 2 credits of LIB251/HON351 are required before you start the capstone.
 - Then 2 credits of either HON451 or a discipline based senior seminar/capstone course.
 - Capstone projects may be:
 - Applied Projects (business or program plans, curricular design, etc.)
 - Creative Projects (Art, Music, Photography, Creative Writing, etc.)
 - Research Projects (experiments, social research, ethnography, etc.)
- Participate in the Honors Connect Co-Curricular requirement
 - Each Semester: 10 Connect Co-Curricular Credits gives you Priority Enrollment for next term.
 - \circ Cumulative: Minimum of 6 Connect Co-Curricular activities (\approx 12 credits) to complete the program.
- Honors designation on transcript and diploma and Honors regalia for commencement.
