## **Honors Program Curriculum Overview**

For Transfer students

**University Honors Program** is a 16 credit hour program, inclusive of an Honors Capstone requirement. In most majors, many of the courses can double dip toward the required major, LAC, or electives credits – meaning that they count toward your 120 credits toward your degree and are not "extra." In some cases, there may be additional credit hours required to complete Honors, especially if there are transfer credits that do not apply to the major directly. If they are additional to the degree, Federal Financial Aid may not cover the cost – however other sources of financial aid such as scholarships and our Schulze funding can potentially apply. Discuss this with the Honors Program staff and the Office of Financial Aid if you have any questions.

#### **UNIVERSITY HONORS PROGRAM (16 Credit Hours)**

- 12 credits of General Honors Coursework which includes: Honors seminars &/or applied learning options (internship/study abroad and research courses.)
  - Max of 6 credits of lower division courses If you still need LACs in the LAA2 or LAA3 or LAB3 categories consider utilizing Honors seminars to meet those requirements. Any of these courses count toward the lower division:
    - **UNIV101** (LAB3) This is also required for Psych majors and therefore for transfer psychology students this will double count towards Honors. Offered in Fall 2025.
    - **HON100** Honors Connection I varying topics. Offered as "From Surviving to Thriving in 21st Century" in Fall 2025.
    - HON180 Great Ideas in Context (LAA2- Lit&Humanities and LAIS-International Studies) Offered in Fall 2025
    - HON182 Confluence of Cultures (LAA2- Lit&Humanities and LAMS-Multicultural Studies)
    - HON185 Religions and Worldviews (LAA3- Ways of Thinking) .Offered Fall 2025.
    - **HON200** Honors Connection II Varying topics. Offered in Spring 2026 as Olympics in Society and includes a Spring Break trip to Milan, Italy.
    - HON267 Cultures of Consciousness (LAB3). Will be offered in Spring 2026
  - 6 to 12 credits of upper division courses All of the 12 General Honors credits MAY come from Upper Division coursework and can include
    - **HON395:** Special Topics courses (including the Fall 2025 Cultural Depictions of Middle Earth, and two options in Spring 2026.
    - Internships/Practicum/Student Teaching /Field Experience/Nursing Clinicals
    - Study Abroad (faculty led programs, spring break, summer or full semester abroad)
    - Research Courses (includes PSY201; CRJ380; BIO422 etc.)
    - SEE CATALOG for full list of courses that automatically apply to Honors credits.
- Honors Capstone 4 credits. Honors Capstone projects begin with 2 credits in first semester through LIB251 and HON351, then 1-2 credits over 1-2 semesters in either HON451 or in a discipline-based capstone course (such as GEOG or HIST senior seminars).

Project types may include:

- o <u>Creative</u> project (e.g. music, art, creative writing, dance, theatre);
- Applied project (e.g. business, marketing or non-profit plan, classroom design, curriculum plan, leadership project); or
- o Research project in any major.

## New Student Orientation and Course Registration Instructions

#### For Transfer students

- → If you have already registered check to see if one of these options will fit in your first semester plan. You may need to swap out a course that can be taken in a future semester instead.
- o Please contact your regular major advisor for advice as to which course can be moved back.
- → If you have not yet registered please do the following:
- O PLEASE TELL YOUR ADVISOR THAT YOU ARE IN THE HONORS PROGRAM!
- o Have THIS SHEET with you when you register.
- → Register for at least one of the following Honors Program courses or options:

#### If you are a Junior or Senior Transfer student

You should enroll in <u>both</u> of the following courses. They occur simultaneously and are taught together (thus same time/day). If you have any issues with overrides needed to register (you receive an error) please email us at <a href="https://en.arch.edu.needed">honors@unco.edu</a> and save the space for the class in your schedule.

- ☐ LIB251-001 Research as Inquiry 1 credit Mondays 1600-1700 AND
- ☐ HON351-001 JR Honors Seminar 1 credit, Mondays 1701-1800 (NOTE: register for 1 credit ONLY.)

#### If you are a Sophomore with 45-59 credits

You May enroll in LIB251 & HON351 (above) if you meet one of the following criteria:

- Natural Science Majors (Bio, Chem, Physics, SES, Nutrition, etc. but not PRE-nursing)
- CRJ, Psychology or Sociology majors and have taken or concurrently enrolled in research methods.
- Other majors and would specifically like to begin your capstone (e.g. you already have an idea of what you would like to do for a capstone), especially if you have 50+ credits.

# If you have less than 60 credits (or do not want to begin capstone this semester)
