Greetings from the Honors Director

The University of Northern Colorado Honors Program continued this past year to hone its focus on developing student problem solvers by supporting interdisciplinary coursework, experiential learning, undergraduate research, and creative and applied projects. Our graduates represent a

have pursued their own individual interests and created projects that are both personally meaningful and significant to their disciplines. The Honors Program served just over 250 students in 2017-2018 from all Colleges on campus, with the following breakout:

Our students this past year reflected the diverse composition of the University demonstrating our intentional focus on accessibility. Our graduates included traditional students graduating in as little as 2-3 years at UNC, as well as returning adult students who brought life experience with

them to share. A few highlights of our student demographics:

46% of honors students are first generation (compared to 35% rate for UNC)
43% of upper division honors and 35% of all honors students classified themselves as other

than "white/Caucasian" (compared to 43% rate for UNC)

11-12 18% of honors students were out of state (compared to 9% UNC rate)

Honors Interdisciplinary Program - Connecting ideas

This year marked the first that the Honors Interdisciplinary Program encouraged the development of personalized tracks of intellectual development through the lower division curriculum. As a way of spurring students into thinking deeper and making connections between courses and ideas, as well as a way for students in jam packed degree programs to find room for honors thinking, the new "theme-based" path was available. Students in this program also have the option of exploring more widely the "Life of the Mind" through that eponymous curriculum. MIND courses continue to be favorites among honors students, with Dr. Bovaird-Abbo's Contemporary Arts Connection course that explores the world of JRR Tolkien, and Dr. Kimball's Confluence of Cultures course that connects UNC students with students from Europe and the Middle East through the Soliya project, as examples.

Upper Division Honors - Student-driven, inquiry-based learning

Upper Division Honors students included over 51 individuals progressing toward their goal of producing an honors thesis or creative capstone project. The program continues to link senior students with those just starting the process, with programs such as Honors Research Night and HON451 cohort meetings. Completed honors thesis projects this year included a variety of examples including mindfulness-based practice research, research on the health of the Poudre River, a GIS analysis of urban development in Mongolia, a mathematics thesis on hypergraph colorings, and a fictional creative story revolving around discovering what is important in life.

The learning is everywhere

In the Fall Semester, students from the President's Leadership Program (PLP) and students from the Leadership Studies Minor completed the Senior Seminar class project that exemplifies the values of the President's Leadership Program and the best of what Leadership Studies has to offer students and the UNC community. This course challenges students to select a topic in order to critically consider the ideals and sentiments that serve as the foundation for scholarly discourse and social discourse on global justice. This year's class partnered with UNC's Assault Survivors Advo-

cacy Program (ASAP) to explore new and innovative ways to educate and empower staff and students to combat sexual assault at UNC. The students designed a five-year curriculum aimed at providing survivor support, clarification of policy, education, school-wide activism, and development of a culture of respect on campus. These results were presented to ASAP stakeholders and are being utilized for further program development.

Colorado Leadership Alliance Summit

In January, students from UNC's President's Leadership Program and El Pomar Scholars traveled to the Tivoli Student Union for the 2018 Colorado Leadership Alliance Summit. Students from 13 Colorado Colleges and Universities engaged in meaningful conversations about Colorado's Civic DNA. Participants attended breakout sessions on Inclusivity, Collaboration, Shared Vision, Leadership, and

Responsibility presented by some of the foremost thinkers and doers in each of the respective categories. The Keynote was delivered by Brett Mitchell, Music Director of the Colorado Symphony and participants also spent an hour on a Mentor's Walk with business and community leaders from the Denver Metro Area.



This year the Directors of both the Honors Program and the McNair Scholars Program travelled to the National Collegiate Honors Conference in Atlanta, Georgia this past November. With the theme "Just Honors," the conference offered insights and opened dialogue for educators, students and administrators to explore issues of social justice, inclusion and equity. Bryan Stevenson, author of Just Mercy, and founder of the Equal Justice Initiative, was keynote speaker, and offered a

challenge to all honors students to become advocates for social justice in their own communities. Other hot issues that emerged at the conference included mental health challenges among high achieving students and how to develop curriculum paths that work for honors students who are transferring in greater numbers of college credit from AP, IB, and dual-enrollment courses from high school. The directors attended several sessions regarding points based systems for both curricular and co-curricular paths through honors, and also sessions regarding inclusive admissions practices.

Eugene D. and Peggy J. Koplitz Scholarship

Dr. Koplitz, Professor Emeritus of Educational Psychology, came to UNC in 1958 and studied mental processes of advanced intellects. Because of his experience in gifted education, the task of establishing an Honors program was given to Koplitz. In only a year-and-a half, Koplitz established the UNC Honors Program with partnership in 19 departments on campus as well as establishing the Honors thesis tradition that still stands to this day as one of the more rigorous Honors thesis requirements in the State. As founder of the UNC's Honors Program, Gene Koplitz began a tradition that centered on the intellectual development of many of the University's top students. Throughout his professional career, Dr. Koplitz presented research papers at international, regional, state, and local levels, and he made a large impact on all he met and taught. Sadly, Gene passed away in early September 2017, and is survived by his wife, Peggy, his children David and Stephanie, and five grandchildren.

Becky R. Edgerton Memorial Honors Scholarship

The Honors Program is pleased to recognize the generosity of Ronald K Edgerton who provided the gifts to create the permanent fund to perpetuate excellence in the University Honors Program through the Becky R. Edgerton Memorial Honors Scholarship. Dr. Edgerton was Director of the Honors Program from 1985 to 2000. Becky Edgerton (April 22, 1941-December 17, 1999) loved poetry, opera and good movies; The New York Times Book Review and The New Yorker magazine, good literature, wine and conversation; feminist theory, loyal friends and her family. For her, reading was a way of life, and she read just about everything. She published poetry, taught in the Honors and Life of the Mind programs. We honor Becky Edgerton through the Becky R. Edgerton Memorial Honors Scholarship.





John Bromley Memorial Scholarship Fund

The President's Leadership Program was founded through an El Pomar grant in the spring of 2000. With the help of UNC's President, Hank Brown, John Bromley was the first Program Director and the main creator of the Presidential Leadership Program. John brought Amy Smart, a former student of his and a UNC alumnus, on board to help with the Administrative side of the program, as he tackled the curricular side. The inaugural class of PLP scholars began the program in the fall of 2000. John's wife, Susan Bromley, started the John Bromley Memorial Scholarship Endowment to continue John's passion for the President's Leadership Program in 2009.

Marie Livingston Honors Scholarship

Dr. Marie Leigh Livingston is Professor Emerita of Economics at University of Northern Colorado. She came to Colorado in 1979 to work for the Economic Research Service, U.S.D.A. and began her career at UNC in 1985 after earning her Ph.D. While at UNC, she was Professor and Chair of Economics, and served as Director of several interdisciplinary programs, including the University Honors Program, International Trade and Relations (now International Affairs) and the Life of the Mind Program. With specializations in water resources and international economics, she worked extensively in Central Europe and has been a visiting professor at University of Minnesota, University of Frankfurt and University of Madrid. In 2009 she was a Fulbright Senior Specialist at the University of Economics in Prague. Since retiring from UNC, her most recent international experience has been to teach at Foreign Trade University in Hanoi, Vietnam.





Courage to Excel Scholarship—Colorado Department of Higher Education

Barbara's academic excellence and devotion to her field (international relations) led her to work abroad with Columbia's Teachers for East Africa during the completion of her Master's coursework. She taught at a residential boy's secondary school in Kericho, Kenya for two years, teaching world history and researching the development of political parties, which had just begun in Kenya in 1964 after emerging from British colonial rule. She continued to be involved with the local and international community, sponsoring the Model UN Program and assuming a leadership position in her church's efforts to welcome and resettle refugee families from Southeast Asia. It is sincerely hoped that this scholarship bearing Barbara's name may assist students at UNC to reach their life goals and full potential.
