## Welcome From the Honors Director

Welcome to the Center for Honors, Scholars, and Leadership. At the heart of our Center we find our students, who continue to inspire and amaze us. In the Honors Program, we support over 200 honors students through interdisciplinary curriculum, research opportunities, and professional development.

This year, we instituted our first Honors 101 class for all incoming freshmen honors students. This course integrated the participation of upper division honors students as teaching assistants and peer mentors. The upper division TA's assisted incoming

freshmen in adjusting to college and connecting with their community, as well as leading discussions and recitation session reflections.

Honors freshmen were also integrated as participants into our annual Honors Research Night, which provides opportunities for upper division students to present their honors thesis work. Freshmen also attended our second annual Coffee with the Profs event, building bridges between honors students and faculty members on campus. The Schulze Interdisciplinary Speaker Series continues to be a popular extracurricular activity for incoming freshmen as well. By inviting freshmen to a variety of academic events, we help to connect students to the concept of scholarly development.

Through our Upper Division Honors Program, we've facilitated Faculty-Student honors project mentor experiences with over 60 students and 50 faculty members from across campus pursuing the honors thesis experience in 2016-2017. We are proud to have students working on projects in many different disciplines and project types.

This past year the Honors Program has also been conducting its own research. Our graduate assistant, Dylan Ghaffari, is in the process of investigating the unique experiences of honors students at UNC, providing us with insight into how being part of Honors affects students' identity. This research study will be submitted to the national Honors journals for publication in 2018.

Speaking of our amazing students, our alumni continue to proceed into diverse paths after leaving UNC. One of our graduating seniors, Cat Hildebrand, has been accepted to a screenwriting master's program, while Evan Bo, an acting major, will be traveling to Togo, Africa with the Peace Corps. William McShane is also going abroad next year, to study History in a graduate school program in Ireland. Carly Browning has been accepted into Medical School at the University of New Mexico, after completing both Honors and President's Leadership Programs while also competing as a Student Athlete in Track & Field. And these are just a few of our creative, driven students.

## The learning is everywhere

In the Fall Semester of the 2016 academic year students from the President's Leadership Program (PLP) and other students in the LEAD 497 course, completed two capstone class projects that exemplify the values of the President's Leadership Program and the best of what Leadership Studies has to offer students and the UNC community.

## **Bear Pantry**

In 2014, the University of Northern Colorado opened their campus food pantry, Bear Pantry, to serve students who experience food insecurity while attending classes at the university. UNC's Bear Pantry is a collaborative initiative that seeks to assist these affected students, supporting them as they work towards degree completion. In fall semester, students from the Center for Honors, Scholars, and Leadership's Capstone Leadership Seminar cre-


ated an action proposal with multiple suggestions for program implementation at the Bear Pantry.

## **DREAM On**

The second capstone proposal reviewed and identified opportunities available to the UNC to provide better support to students without documentation through the DREAMer Engagement Program. The DREAM Act (Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors), centers on this population's access to college and, ultimately, citizenship of the United States. Through this proposal's call to action, the students challenged UNC administration to identify ways of supporting students who lack documentation.

## **Random Acts of Kindness**

The Ambassadors for Student Leadership Club (ASLC) has attracted a new group of students, welcoming student from both the President's Leadership Program as well as students who have declared the Leadership Minor. Earlier this Spring, ASLC hosted an inspiring event and welcomed Charlene Moser to campus share the story of Lynda Drabek, an organ transplant recipient who died at the far-too-young age of 30. Charlene brought Lynda's life story to campus and UNC students were inspired and empowered to change the world one per-







# DONOR RECOGNITION

## Eugene and Peggy Koplitz

Dr. Koplitz, Professor Emeritus of Educational Psychology, came to UNC in 1958 and studied mental processes of advanced intellects. Because of his experience in gifted education, the task of establishing an Honors program was given to Koplitz. In only a year-and-a half, Koplitz established the UNC Honors Program with partnership in 19 departments on campus as well as establishing the Honors thesis tradition that still stands to this day as one of the more rigorous Honors thesis requirements in the State. As founder of the UNC's Honors Program, Gene Koplitz began a tradition that centered on the intellectual development of many of the University's top students. Gene and his wife Peggy have witnessed the significant growth and long lasting legacy of the Honors Program, and still support the university through the Koplitz Forum as well as long time supporters of Michener Library, having known James Michener himself. The Koplitz's are often attendees at the Center for Honors, Scholars and Leadership Banquet as well.

Edgerton Memorial Honors Scholarship. Dr. Edgerton was Director of the Honors Program from 1985 to 2000.

Becky Edgerton (April 22, 1941-December 17, 1999) loved poetry, opera and good movies; The New York Times Book Review and The New Yorker magazine, good literature, wine and conversation; feminist theory, loyal friends and her family. For her, reading was a way of life, and she read just about everything. She published poetry, taught in the Honors and Life of the Mind programs. We honor Becky Edgerton through the Becky R. Edgerton Memorial Honors Scholarship.

## John Bromley Memorial Scholarship Fund

The President's Leadership Program was founded through an El Pomar grant in the spring of 2000. With the help of UNC's President, Hank Brown, John Bromley was the first Program Director and the main creator of the Presidential Leadership Program. John brought Amy Smart, a former student of his and a UNC alumnus, on board to help with the Administrative side of the program, as he tackled the curricular side. The inaugural class of PLP scholars began the program in the fall of 2000. John's wife, Susan Bromley, started the John Bromley Memorial Scholarship Endowment to continue John's passion for the President's Leadership Program in 2009.





## Marie Livingston Honors Scholarship

Dr. Marie Leigh Livingston is Professor Emerita of Economics at University of Northern Colorado. She came to Colorado in 1979 to work for the Economic Research Service, U.S.D.A. and began her career at UNC in 1985 after earning her Ph.D. While at UNC, she was Professor and Chair of Economics, and served as Director of several interdisciplinary programs, including the University Honors Program, International Trade and Relations (now International Affairs) and the Life of the Mind Program. ## Denise King - Colorado Leadership Alliance


