Mixed-methods research on the transnational dimensions of mental health and emotion in Southern Mexico. Project focuses on the culture and political economy of mental healthcare; experiences and conceptions of emotion and psychopathology; the local incorporation of globalizing 'psy-' concepts and practices; and the interface between immigration and mental health.

"Health Citizenship Among Latino Immigrants in Rural and Urban Colorado - NSF-Funded" (On-Going).

Using a comparative, multi-site design, my co-PI and are exploring to what extent safety net institutions in two different geographical areas within Colorado are able to challenge restrictive definitions of health citizenship in order to facilitate immigrants' health care access and sense of inclusion in the nation. Conducting ethnographic research in one urban and one rural site—each with dramatically different local-level immigration histories—will produce a nuanced analysis of how local-level factors may challenge or reinforce exclusionary health care and immigration policies at the national level.

Community engaged research project (community partner: Salud Family Health Centers) investigating how various groups of Coloradans understand health and how culture, ethnicity, and socio-economic status impact patients' experiences of and access to medical treatment.
