The Environmental and Sustainability Studies degree at UNC works to ground you in thinking systemically about the planet and its problems and strives to show you how to apply sustainability solutions to every area of how we will live and work in our 21st-century world.

You will learn about:

- Re-localizing our living areas and rethinking the built environment
- The development of ecological economic systems
- The redesign and development of industrial ecology
- Applications of science and technology for sustainable use of natural resources
- The role of health, happiness and well-being in fulfilling human needs
- The promotion of global equity and justice

Almost every career involves sustainability as a requirement to make it fit the growing need to create a better, more just 21st-century world. With this degree, you could pursue jobs as a sustainability officer (for academic systems, government positions and businesses), sustainability planner and analyst, outreach and communications specialist, sustainability manager, energy analyst, facilities analyst, community development and permaculture specialist, health specialist and environmental scientist.
