Research in Progress

"Actresses, Performance, and Urban Publics in Early Republican Beijing" (On-Going). My book project is a social and cultural history of the newly emerged actresses of Peking Opera in early Republican Beijing. I challenge the accepted view by showing that actresses shaped the professional practices, opera repertoire, and performance styles no less profoundly than actors. I argue that the transgression of actresses across boundaries—theatrical and social, private and public, sexual and moral—amounted to a subtle gender and cultural revolution, occurring before as well as during the iconoclastic May Fourth movement. This project contributes to the history of emotions in the Chinese case; incorporates gossip, rumor and scandal in discussions of public space; and points to the neglected role of cultural conservatives in creating the Chinese modern.
