The History Department offers two BA degrees: History Liberal Arts and History Secondary Education. Students who earn the secondary education degree graduate with licensure to teach social studies. Both degrees lead to careers in government, law, international affairs and business. With courses on American, European and World History, faculty members work closely with students as they engage the sources of the past and craft original research and prepare for life beyond the classroom.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Students collaborate with faculty who are experts in their fields
- Lectures, discussions, readings and research engage students in an active learning environment
- All majors pursue individual research projects in the senior seminar capstone course
- Each History major is assigned a full-time faculty member as an advisor who can answer questions about registration, coursework, and internships
- Study abroad, foreign languages, internships and directed study insure a varied and individualized course of study

History Liberal Arts Majors must either have a minor or a second major. History Secondary Education Majors must have a B- GPA at the end of their junior year.
