This four-year plan is a <u>recommended schedule</u> to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 31 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Curriculum; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or concentration may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.

Admission Requirement – See Professional Teacher Education Program (PTEP) section in current catalog for additional admission requirements.

Minor Required – No minor required.

Notes -

- 1. One of the following, HIST 100/101, 120/121, HIST 110/112/113/114/115/118 may also be applied toward the Liberal Arts Curriculum in History.
- 2. Two of these four required social science courses (ECON 203, GEOG 100, PSCI 100) may be applied toward the Liberal Arts Curriculum in Social and Behavioral Sciences.
- 3. HIST 110/112/113/114/115/118/120/121, ANT 110 or GEOG 100 may also be applied towards the International Studies requirement in the Liberal Arts Curriculum.
- 4. In addition to the required courses, each major will also take 24 additional hours of electives, 200 level or above.
 - a. At least three credits must be taken in each of the three geographic areas (Europe, United States, Africa/Asia/Latin America/World).
 - b. Of the remaining 15 hours, no more than 9 can be taken in any one of the three geographic areas
 - c. At least 18 of the 24 hours must be taken from courses numbered 300 or 400.
- 5. History majors must obtain a grade of "C" or better in all courses required for the major at UNC. Majors receiving a grade of "D+"or lower must retake the course—or an equivalent approved by the academic advisor—and receive a grade of "C-" or better to have the course counted toward the major.
- 6. All history courses numbered 300 or higher include a research and writing component.
- 7. Only 6 hours of HIST prefixes may be counted toward the LAC.
