MINOR: History Liberal Arts majors must have a minor of at least 18 credits, or a second major. (See reverse for more details.)

LAC Notes:

1. History Liberal Arts majors must complete a total of 40 credits in the LAC.
2. Liberal Arts majors should take three Area 3 classes or two Area 5 classes.
3. If the student is exempt from an area, receiving no credit, s/he must make up that credit by taking another LAC course. Students must have a total of 40 credits in the LAC in order to graduate.
4. Transfer students with the AA degree are exempt from the LAC.

Transfer credits for the LAC may only be approved by the home department. History advisors may not assign LAC credit for anything other than an Area 4 course. There is a form for this on the Registrar's website.

Students intending to study abroad or on the National Student Exchange program must give the advisor a form that lists the classes that will be taken while overseas or at another school. The advisor determines who the classes are likely to transfer and the Chair must sign off. If the student takes different classes than what is approved, s/he must email the advisor who will do another analysis of how the courses are likely to transfer. That email should be copied and placed in the student's file for future reference. When the student returns, s/he has to have an official transcript sent to UNC for the transfer of credits to occur. This often takes an entire semester to sort out.

HIST 1XX, 2XX or 3XX transfer courses require a course adjustment form in order for the credits to count towards the major. The advisor should fill out the form, make clear in the box on the second page exactly how the class is to transfer (for example as a 200-level American history course). After the Chair has signed the form, a copy should be placed in the student's file and the original sent to the Registrar.
