SETTING UP YOUR WORKSTATION

Dell Laptop Dock

There are two types of docking stations for your DELL laptop. The WD19 is rectangular, while the WD15 is more of a square. In other words, they are similar in form and factor—with the exception of the monitor ports (the one shown in the video is a WD19).

WD19 Dock (Front)

- 1. USB-C input
- 2. USB input
- 3. Speaker/microphone combination jack

WD19 Dock (Back)

- 1. Audio line-out to speakers
- 2. Display port for monitor
- 3. Display port for monitor
- 4. HDMI port for monitors
- 5. USB-C input
- 6. USB input (for your keyboard & mouse)
- 7. Ethernet input (network port to phone)
- 8. Power supply input for docking station

WD15 Dock

Similar to the WD19 Dock, the WD15 has a mini-HDMI display port instead of a full-size display port. HDMI and VGA (3) ports are for displays/monitors. Ethernet (4) or network cables should be plugged into the wall interface, as well as your network phone, and from the network phone to your docking station. 
HP UltraSlim Docking Station - Rear side

HP Slim Docks

Ethernet or network cables should be plugged into the wall interface, as well as your network phone, and from the network phone to your docking station. See Phone Connections below.

Connecting Your Slim Dock

Ensure the docking station power supply plugs into location 9 (shown in the picture) and not 2 (on the far left).



- 1. Lock slot (lock not included)
- 2. Docking station cable lock slot (lock not included)
- 3. Side docking connector
- 4. VGA port
- 5. LAN/Ethernet port
- DisplayPort 1.2 (2)

- 7. USB 3.0 ports (3)
- 8. USB 3.0 charging port (1)
- 9. Power connector
- 10. Line in jack
- 11. Line out jack

Types of Monitor or Video Connections

In the video we talked about Display Port and HDMI mainly, but in the graphic to the right you will see each type of video/monitor connector. The monitor will also need power.











Adjusting Multiple Screens

- 1. Right-click anywhere on the Desktop
- 2. Select 'Display Settings'
- 3. Left-click 'Identify'
- 4. Select the monitor you would like to adjust and drag it to the appropriate location
- Left-click 'Apply'
- 6. Nicely done!

Phone Connections

Ethernet or network cables should be plugged into the wall interface, as well as your network phone, and from the network phone to your docking station, as shown in the graphic below.
