Overview and Use Case


The 2021 online classroom template provides instructors with a collection of templates assembled according to best practices in online course design inside of a Canvas developmental (TEMPLATE-DEV) shell. Use this guide to navigate and utilize the tools within the 2021 online classroom template.

The Online Classroom Template Home Page

The homepage includes announcements, a banner image, additional links to the Syllabus and Course FAQs, quick links to the course Modules, and Course Goals.

1 – Announcements: Announcements posted on the homepage reflect the content created in the Announcements tool. Each online classroom template comes with an announcement titled, MUST READ: Online Classroom Template. If you are new to using the online classroom template, read the announcement before you begin. - **2 Banner Image:** The banner image can be edited from the home page by deleting the existing image and uploading a different image.
- **3 Additional Links:** The Home Page also includes a link to the **Syllabus** page and a link to an ungraded discussion called **Course FAQs**, which is intended as a forum for participants to ask and answer course-related questions. For more information, select the link below.

- 4 Quick links to Modules: The quick links on the home page are a reflection of the Modules Index page that can also be date activated to correspond with the course term dates. The key to working within the online classroom template is to understand that the quick links and module lists on the home page show everything in each module when that module's quick link is active.





The Online Classroom Template Modules Index Page

Canvas Modules can contain most of the tools that Canvas offers, including content pages, assignments, discussions, quizzes, files, and external links. The online classroom template also includes two unpublished instructor's modules, a student Start Here module, and one module for each week of the term.



- **1 Instructor's Modules:** The online classroom template includes two unpublished instructor's modules within the Modules Index Page:
- The [TEMPLATE] TOOLBOX for INSTRUCTORS module includes two video tutorials that will get you started with editing or duplicating the template pages.
- The Course Management Guides (do not publish) module includes guides to help you with many common Canvas functions.
- Please note that the Fall 2021 online classroom template has replaced the Course Managements Guides (do not publish) module with a link to a training module.

WARNING: Most of the templates can be duplicated except for templated Canvas Quizzes. If you are importing quizzes from other courses, and would like to have the template applied, contact instructional.design@unco.edu. We can apply the template to any existing quizzes within one business day.


2 – Start Here Module: the studentfocused Start Here module is designed to assist students with getting set up to work within Canvas.

The Start Here module includes two pages, the Welcome page and Introductions discussion, that can be customized to further facilitate student engagement as students begin the course.
