

Preparing for RID National Certification, Part I

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO

As shared in the Orientation module to obtain RID certification one must;

- 1. satisfy CASLI's eligibility to test requirements,
- 2. satisfy RID's educational requirement and,
- 3. pass the <u>Center for the Assessment of Sign Language Interpretation (CASLI)</u> Generalist Knowledge and Generalist Performance exams.

CASLI is the organization that develops and administers interpreting exams. Once you have passed the exams you are on your way towards RID national certification.

To maintain RID certification one must;

- 1. be a current certified member of RID,
- 2. maintain the required **Continuing Education Units (CEUs)** and,
- 3. adhere their interpreting practice to the <a>Code of <a>Professional <a>Conduct.



Preparing for RID National Certification, Part II

Below are resources to get you started on your journey towards RID national certification.

- 1. CASLI Generalist Knowledge Exam: You will need to pass this exam first, before taking the Generalist Performance portion of the exam. Review the information from CASLI regarding the domains of what the test covers and its list of recommended preparation materials. Aligning with CASLI's recommended reading list, IRIS has developed a document (posted in Canvas) pointing you to the online location of these reading materials. Many of these materials are available to you at no cost via the UNC Library as an electronic resource. We recommend that you take full advantage of these resources while you still have access to these materials as an IRIS participant. Upon conclusion of the grant you will no longer have access to the UNC Library.
- 2. CASLI Generalist Performance Exam: This is the second portion of the CASLI exam. IRIS has partnered with the CATIE Center's Dive In Stepping Stones program to give you access to their Performance exam preparation materials. The CATIE Center will be offering its self-directed CASLI Generalist Performance exam preparation course in May 2025. Be sure to subscribe to the CATIE Center's mailing list to receive registration information.
