 pilot partnering institutions with an external vendor to support industry
 partnerships for WBL, and allows institutions to use work study allocation
 funds to offset cost of non-credit bearing WBL
 - HB25-1218: Concurrent enrollment expansion -- postponed indefinitely
 - HB25-1211 Allow Emily Griffith Technical to award AAS degrees.

- Indirect Syllabus Review
 - O Review checklist and LAC Course Approval website include Board Policy Manual (BPM) reference but not University Regulations (UR) reference. There are differences between the two on course outline requirements, do we need to make a change?
 - PTA CCC ISR Report
 - Final Review:
 - ENG 200
 - o Had every gtP requirement but CDHE statement
 - Brownlee will add the CDHE language since she is currently teaching the course.
 - Mapping present but could better reflect the specific competencies and SLOs.
 - o Per final review, recommend removing from course LAC.
 - Will remain in Curriculum AY 25-26...
 - To remain in LAC for 26-27, need to submit the course through the approval process and reach the LAC stage in the curriculum workflow by Nov. 1, 2025.
 - MUS 140
 - Mapping was present though highly generalized without specific assignments
 - Will have to go into more detail for direct assessment
 - o Missing course objective and learning outcomes detailed in the BPM.
 - The course objectives are part of the University Regulations

- MUS 296
 - o Final exam/closure policy is missing but meets criteria.
- Re-Review
 - MT 296
 - o Final exam/closure policy is missing but meets criteria.
 - PHIL 270, PHIL 280, THEA 296, THEA 297
 - o Does not meet criteria
- Initial Review
 - All courses under the initial review stage did not meet the criteria.
- MOTION: Casey moves to accept the PTA CCC report for Spring 2025, seconded by Steele
- DISCUSSION:
 - Consider requiring units plan for reviewing instructional syllabi.
 - Nothing would need to be done in the workflow they will need to add an extra attachment.
 - The course description is part of UR
- VOTE: Motion passes unanimously
- HLH CCC ISR Report
 - Smith only had the reports for the Initial Review at the time and will insert the Final and Re-reviews.
 - Initial Review
 - HIST 114, HST 115, HUM 122, MUS 212
 - o Meets criteria
 - MAS 110
 - Does not meet criteria and recommend returning to department for revisions.
 - General Discussion
 - Re-review
 - All courses under the re-review stage did not meet the criteria.
 - Final Review
 - AFS 100, AFS 101 meets the criteria with recommendation to update syllabus to reference additional document for course schedule.
 - ENG 133
 - o Missing mapping and CDHE statement is not verbatim
 - Per final review, recommend removing from course LAC.
 - Will remain in Curriculum AY 25-26...
 - To remain in LAC for 26-27, need to submit the course through the approval process and reach the LAC stage in the curriculum workflow by Nov. 1, 2025.
- o MOTION: Casey moves to approve the Initial review reports, seconded by Steele
- VOTE: Motion passes unanimously
- Review of Codification Edits on Bylaws
- SCI 265 3 Credit Lab Course
 - Motion: Restrict this course to ELED majors. Recommend Accepting moved by Muller seconded by Smith

- In fall 2022 it was discussed and approved to accept the requested change of SCI 265 from a 4-credit course to a 3-credit course.
 - Matchett found that the restriction to ELED was stated at that time but not implemented.
- If a course s required for the major, it can't be required that the course be taken to fulfill LAC requirement.
- Courses can be restricted for enrollment to students in the major.
- Do we know enrollment of this course includes non-ELED majors
 - It does occasionally, a few students annually.
- Do advisors know the credit mismatch?
 - Yes, but with changeover in advisor scan be easy to overlook.
- Matchett does not think this will be controversial and will speak with units
- Vote: Motion passes unanimously
- Student Request Gabriel Hanson Seven Science Credits without Lab
 - o Motion: Grant a one-time exception due to advisor error. Recommend Accepting moved by Steele, seconded by Geisendorfer.
 - The official request document rational should state that there will be additional training to ensure this error will not happen again and that this is a one-time thing.
 - Vote: Motion passes unanimously
- First Call: Nominees for AY 25-26 LAC Chair and Vice-Chair
 - o Muller will be on sabbatical in the spring but is willing to serve in the Fall.
- Discussion: Course in ISR Re-Review but not taught in Current AY, should course stay in rereview for next AY or move to final review for next AY?
 - o Tabled until next meeting.

 - o Spring 2021 Revised Competencies and SLOs Full <u>Update Process</u>
