Comments

- The gtP categories correspond to UNC's current Areas 1-6 of the Core. UNC currently requires courses from two different subcategories in areas 3 and 5 and from two different prefixes in area 6. The CDHE does not allow this so the Council changed it to a recommendation.
- Written Communication: The Advanced Writing course would be focused on disciplinary specific writing.
- Each unit offering courses in area 6 would be asked to specify which courses are mutually exclusive and would add that information to the catalog.
- 120 credits for a degree is the absolute minimum required by the state and UNC's accrediting body, the Higher Learning Commission. Nursing and teacher prep programs have been given permission to go over 120 required credits but the state is pushing hard to decrease those credits to 120. By reducing the restrictions within the core, we will be assisting programs in lowering credit requirements to 120.
