# THE BASIN NEIGHBORHOOD | basin.desk@unco.edu

The Basin Neighborhood is located the closest to Athletics facilities, the Gear Shop and Outdoor Pursuits, the Campus Recreation Center, Holmes Dining Hall and Michener Library on West Campus. The Basin Neighborhood is great for students who want to be in the middle of all the campus action but also within walking distance of numerous areas where students can study, attend athletic events, play disc golf, eat with friends and socialize. The Basin Neighborhood desk is in Harrison Hall.


HARRISON HALL – Providing a home away from home to the majority of UNC first-year students, Harrison Hall is one of the largest UNC communities, with five floors and 540+ fellow students. Bears can experience supportive connections within the Pre-Nursing Residential Connection or the Outdoor Pursuits program. The suite-style living and winter/spring break availability make Harrison a great option.

TURNER HALL – The second tallest building in Greeley with 13 floors, Turner Hall is home to 330 UNC Bears who enjoy single bedroom suites with shared living-room and bathroom spaces. Turner is home to the Criminology and Criminal Justice Residential Connection. Between classes, Bears can enjoy blue skies and fresh air on the Turner Green, scenic views from one of Tuners 13 TV lounges or playing games together in the game room and lounges.

# THE RIDGE NEIGHBORHOOD | ridge.desk@unco.edu

Located on West Campus, the Ridge Neighborhood is within walking distance of Holmes Dining Hall, the Campus Recreation Center, Turner Green, Campus Commons and the UC. The Ridge Neighborhood surrounds the campus with areas where students can study, play frisbee golf, eat with friends, socialize, and relax on many of the open green spaces. The Ridge Neighborhood desk is in South Hall. Sample rooms shown. Floor plans may vary by room type.



**LAWRENSON HALL** – Nestled within the relaxed, collegial atmosphere of 430+ UNC Bears in Lawrenson Hall is home to the Pet Friendly community, with a maximum of 75 spaces for students to have their dog or cat live with them on campus. There are also 55 spaces for the Transfer Student Community in Lawrenson Hall, where students can connect while accessing campus resources and developing networking skills. The suite-style living and winter/spring break availability make Lawrenson a great option for international UNC Bears. Many Lawrenson rooms include a kitchen.

NORTH HALL – Cozy nooks under circular windows and other social spaces offer 370+ UNC Bears plenty of connection opportunities in North Hall. Business majors and Bears in the Biology program build relationships in their Residential Connections through shared activities and study groups in suite-style options.

**SOUTH HALL** – Spacious suites with a variety of unique social spaces provide community opportunities for the 340+ UNC Bears in South Hall. South Hall is located next to the Holmes Dining and near the Butler-Hancock Athletic Center. The proximity of the Gear Shop, in Harrison Hall, provides convenient access to equipment check out for a Bear's next Outdoor Pursuits adventure.



# **NEIGHBORHOOD FEATURES**

There are a variety of accommodations across each neighborhoods and students can work with the Disability Resource Center to make sure we find the spot on campus that works best for them. Each neighborhood features the following services to help residents succeed.

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CENTER**

This is a community development and engagement space located within each neighborhood where students can congregate with friends, explore campus resources, engage in skill development, and participate in events and activities hosted by your community.

# **NEIGHBORHOOD DESK OPERATIONS**

Each neighborhood has one front desks that serves the entire neighborhood and is open from 8 a.m. to 2 a.m., seven days a week. The neighborhood desks are the best places to get information about housing and residential education, campus, and the Greeley community. Each desk provides assistance with the following needs:

- Answering questions
- · Providing cleaning supplies
- Submitting room repair requests
- Connecting with a Housing & Residential Education staff member
- Scheduling appointments with the Neighborhood Coordinator or a check in/check out

#### **RESIDENT ASSISTANTS**

RAs are student staff members whose primary role is to connect with residents, build community, aid your transition to UNC, and be a resource to you throughout your on-campus living experience.

#### **NEIGHBORHOOD COORDINATORS**

Each neighborhood has two master's level live-in Neighborhood Coordinators who supervise the day-to-day operations of the community. Your Neighborhood Coordinator is a great resource for you while living on campus and if they can't answer your questions, they always know who can! In addition to the basics of managing their communities, each Neighborhood Coordinator has an area of emphasis:

### THE MESA NEIGHBORHOOD | mesa.desk@unco.edu

Named for being located on the epic hill of Central Campus, the Mesa Neighborhood is an active and vibrant part of campus, located within walking distance of Tobey-Kendel Dining Hall, the Student Health and Counseling Centers, Gunter Green, and the University Center. The Mesa Neighborhood showcases beautiful buildings, including some of UNC's most historic buildings, that surround campus community areas where students can study, play music or perform at Garden Theatre, eat with friends, socialize, and relax on the Gunter Green. The Mesa Neighborhood desk is in Wiebking Hall.

ΓHE MESA NEIGHBORHOOD

**BELFORD, DECKER** and **GORDON HALLS** – Community-style rooms offer small hall experience, double and single rooms available. These halls offer community TV and study lounges and kitchen areas.

**BELFORD HALL** – Create long-lasting relationships in the Women's Community at Belford Hall. This cozy living community is home to about 50 UNC students.

**DECKER HALL** – This two-story hall is home to 25+ students featuring a student lounge, a community kitchen, a laundry room and a TV room.

**GORDON HALL** – Located across the street from Cassidy Hall, home to the Student Health Center and Counseling Center, Gordon Hall is home to a cozy community of 25+ Bears in comfy, two-person rooms with gender-specifc community bathrooms.





**SABIN** and **SNYDER HALLS** – Medium sized halls with community-style, deluxe doubles doubles and singles available. Community bathrooms and showers on each floor, kitchens, lounges, TV rooms, study rooms.

SABIN HALL – The close-knit community of Sabin Hall is home to 30+ Bears with cozy deluxe community-style rooms that have their own bathrooms or community-style rooms with a community bathroom. Whether you choose deluxe or traditional, you will be near the University Center and Tobey-Kendel Dining Hall.

snyder Hall – As part of the Central Coalition Community, Snyder Hall is home to 100+ UNC Bears. There are deluxe and community-style rooms. Between classes, Bears can enjoy the Colorado sunshine on the Snyder Green or use one of the Mesa's many





### BOND, BROWN, DICKESON, HANSEN-WILLIS and LUJÁN HALLS

 Two- to six-person suite-style rooms and singles available, a common shared living room with bathrooms, kitchens, lounges, TV rooms, study rooms available.

**BOND HALL** – A cozy home with 50+ UNC Bears located near the Arts Annex, Crabbe Hall and the Norton Theater. Bond has two- to six-person suite-style rooms.

**BROWN HALL** – Join the Residential Connection of the Cumbres Community in Brown Hall. The Cumbres program is a living and learning program for 30+ Bears who are planning to teach in K-12 schools and are working toward an English as a Second Language (ESL) or Bilingual/Bicultural endorsement. Choose from two- to four-person suite-style rooms.

**DICKESON HALL** – Develop new relationships with friends while rooming with two to five fellow students. 50+ Bears living in Dickeson can enjoy the sunshine on the lawn outside of the building or study in the shade of some of the oldest and most majestic trees in Greeley.

HANSEN-WILLIS HALL – Hansen-Willis Hall is home to just over 100 students and has reserved 35 spaces for the Gender, Sexual, and Romantic Identities Residential Connection. The GSRI Residential Connection participants can develop strong connections in support of one another throughout their UNC experience.

**LUJÁN HALL** – Home of the Residential Connection of Honors, Scholars, and Leaders. With 35 Bears, the Honors Program is a community of self-driven, creative problem solvers who pursue inquiry-based learning. Luján Hall has two- to five-person suitestyle rooms.

**WIEBKING** and **WILSON HALLS** – These community-style rooms in larger halls offer double rooms, community bathrooms and showers on each floor, kitchens, lounges, game rooms, TV rooms and study rooms.

**WIEBKING HALL** – The energetic atmosphere in Wiebking Hall is created by many Performing and Visual Arts students in Central

Campus. Use one of the Mesa's many public music rooms, and game rooms to relax, meet others, and have fun.

WILSON HALL – Next door to Tobey-Kendel Dining Hall and across the street from the Asian/Pacific American and Native American Student Services House and the Marcus Garvey Cultural Center.
