Application checklist:

- ✓ **Curriculum Vitae**
- ✓ **Recommendation from a student (approx. one page in length)**
- ✓ **Responses to the following questions/prompts (approx. 4-6 pages in length):**
 1. Why are you interested in the Faculty-in-Residence position? Specifically, what about your experience inside and outside of the classroom with students has led you to believe you would be a good fit for this position?
 2. In approximately one page, outline your diversity statement. This statement should include:
 - a. The value diversity/equity/inclusion brings to the student experience
 - b. Your understanding of and experience with diverse identities and commitment to supporting students who hold diverse identities
 - c. The way(s) you see identity impacting the development of community
 - d. The role of the Faculty in Residence to create and sustain inclusive and equitable environments on campus and in the residence halls
 3. Describe how you would approach collaborative relationships with the variety of staff in your residence hall if selected for the position. Use previous examples of collaboration to illuminate your response. Collaboration in the FIR role includes:
 - a. The Neighborhood Coordinator who is the masters level professional who supervises the student staff in each hall and would be your primary point of contact for work in the hall.
 - b. The Resident Assistants who are student staff living throughout the building and are a residents first line of contact.
 - c. The Residence Hall Association/National Residence Hall Honorary, a programming body consisting of interested hall residents.
 4. What role does student development play in your approach to working with students? Specifically, please reflect on:
 - a. The way student development informs your practice
 - b. Student experiences/moments that exemplify developmental opportunities
 5. Please describe UNC's residential student population and how those characteristics would inform your work in the residence halls.
