Ronald E. McNair was the second African American to fly in space. He received his bachelor's degree magna cum laude in physics from North Carolina A&T State University. Five years later he earned his PhD in physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He was selected by NASA and served as mission specialist aboard the Challenger in 1986. Proceeding his death, he was awarded the Congressional Space Medal of Honor, and the Robert E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate Achievement Program was approved for federal funding. We are dedicated to preserving his legacy of scholarship.


