

Student speaker: Becky Alice De Oliveira

Doctor of Philosophy, Applied Statistics and Research Methods

Becky De Oliveira is an educator, writer, graphic designer, and, most recently, a research methodologist, having returned to higher education for a Ph.D. in Applied Statistics and Research Methods. She previously coordinated a master's program at a university in Michigan, taught various writing and teaching methods courses, and helped doctoral students write dissertations. De Oliveira has published a collection of essays and two children's books, along with dozens of articles, medical reports, advertising copy, radio scripts, book chapters, and academic articles. She worked for a top-10 healthcare advertising agency in the United Kingdom, creating a wide variety of promotional items. At the University of Northern Colorado, De Oliveira has served as program director for a three-year grant funded research project examining interventions to reduce sexual risk in adolescents and young adults. In December of 2021, De Oliveira was diagnosed with glioblastoma, a malignant and aggressive form of brain cancer, which has impaired her ability to read. Despite the challenges, she has continued to enjoy working on her research, and is especially looking forward to graduation! De Oliveira and her husband have two sons, ages 22 and 18.
