According to Census data, approximately 97% of U.S land is rural, yet there are very few public health programs specifically tailored to improve rural health. If you are interested in a program that aims to reduce rural health disparities, this Rural Public Health Certificate equips you with the skills necessary to address pervasive issues like poverty, accidental injury, and inaccessible resources. Through coursework focused on community engagement, you will learn how to address health disparities and coordinate intervention plans with rural communities and beyond.

The Rural Public Health certificate is offered at the Colorado School of Public Health at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC). Weld County, which houses UNC, is home to a strong agriculture and farming community surrounded by several other rural and frontier counties. UNC's Rural Public Health certificate allows you to learn through collaborations with agencies serving these rural communities, and trains you to understand their unique challenges while gaining expertise in strategies to address these challenges.
