PROGRAM AWARDED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE TO SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY GRADUATE STUDENTS

Full-time, regularly-enrolled students seeking the M.A. degree in Speech-Language Pathology can apply for financial aid. Financial aid is made available on a semester basis and renewal is contingent upon quality of work performance (if applicable) and academic eligibility (3.0 or higher GPA for most awards). The amount of work required (if any) and the stipend associated with each award are indicated below.

Departmentally Awarded Financial Assistance

1. Full-Time Graduate Assistantship

Full time tuition (13-16 credits) and up to 10 credits of fees. This award requires 270 hours of work per semester and is awarded based on merit. The position requires the recipient to participate in the teaching and/or research activities of faculty or staff members. Specific duties may include library research; data collection, entry, management and processing; preparation of instructional materials; grading; coordinating training and use of instrumentation; maintaining laboratory equipment, etc. Both non-resident and resident awards are available

Award breakdown by semester:

Year 1 fall, spring, and summer semesters: 16 hours/week stipend and full tuition (up to 16 credits) and up to 10 credits of fees.

Year 2 fall semester: 16 hours/week stipend and full tuition (up to 16 credits) and up to 10 credits of fees.

Year 2 spring and summer semesters: (during internships) Student award moves to Graduate Dean's Scholarship Program. Students are responsible for full tuition and fees but are awarded \$750/semester.

2. Part-Time Graduate Assistantship

This award requires 4-8 hours of work per week and is awarded based on merit. The position requires the recipient to participate in the teaching and/or research activities of faculty or staff members. Specific duties may include library research; data collection, entry, management and processing; preparation of instructional materials; grading; coordinating training and use of instrumentation; maintaining laboratory equipment, etc.

Award breakdown by semester:

Year 1 fall semester: 4 hours/week stipend only

Year 1 spring and summer semesters: 8 hours/week stipend and partial tuition (5 credits)

Year 2 fall semester: 8 hours/week stipend and partial tuition (5 credits)

Spring and summer semesters 2: (during internships) Student award moves to Graduate Dean's Scholarship Program. Students are responsible for full tuition and fees but are awarded \$750/semester.

3. Graduate Dean's Scholarship Program

Departmentally nominated based on merit. Recipients must maintain a minimum of a 3.2 GPA throughout master's program. \$750/semester.
