This worksheet is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

Notes -

The undergraduate degree in Human Services provides students with a wide range of knowledge and skills to be able to work in a variety of human service settings. Students take a core curriculum that provides a liberal arts education and tools needed to be a successful professional in the field of human services. Students then select from among multidisciplinary courses, across the variety of human services content areas. A hallmark of this program is the field work experiences integrated into the course requirements.

The HUSR major includes 27 required credits (HUSR 205, HUSR 300¹, HUSR 410, HUSR 492², STAT 150, and PSY 230). Students select an additional 15 credit hours from the Required Supporting Credits in consultation with their advisors in order to complete the 42-credit major. To meet the minimum 120 credit hours required for graduation, students with an HUSR major take the specified 40-credits in the Liberal Arts Core and 38 University-Wide Elective credits.
