## BS Sport and Exercise Science – Sport Administration Emphasis (cont.)

This worksheet is a <u>recommended schedule</u> to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students** must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.

1. <sup>1</sup>Students are required to take the following Liberal Arts Curriculum:

#### Written Communication - 6 Credits

One course from GT-CO1 (Introductory Writing Course) and one course from GT-CO2 (Intermediate Writing Course: Recommended BA 205 Business Communications

#### Mathematics – 3 Credits

Select one course (Recommended MATH 124 College Algebra)

## Arts & Humanities, History, Social & Behavioral Sciences,

**U.S. Multicultural Studies, and International Studies –15 Credits** Select 2 courses from *Arts & Humanities,* 1 course from *History,* 1 course from *Social & Behavioral Sciences* and 1 additional course from any of these categories (Recommended Courses are: BA 150 Foundation of Business Thoughts, ECON 203 Principles of Macroeconomics, ECON 205 Principles of Microeconomics).

#### U.S. Multicultural and International Studies Requirement:

At least one course (3 credits) must carry a *U.S. Multicultural Studies [MS] designation,* and at least one course (3 credits) must carry an *International Studies [IS] designation.* Courses with these designations are listed below and marked where they appear in the *Arts & Humanities, History, and Social & Behavioral Sciences* categories. In order to complete the Liberal Arts Curriculum within 31 credits, six total credits must be double counted.

# Natural & Physical Sciences - 7 Credits

Two courses required:

One course with a required laboratory. One course with or without a laboratory.

2. <sup>2</sup>Taking the recommended LAC courses (see above) that are required for the major and applying them to the LAC will result in 29 University-Wide Credits needed to complete the degree (120 credits).

- 4. <sup>4</sup>Prior to registering for SES 492, students must have a GPA of 2.7 or better in the SES prefix courses.

Sport Administration is an applied field with diverse content areas and administrative populations. This major allows students to combine sport specific content and administrative practices in preparation for the continually changing world of sport administration. Students who select this emphasis are **not** eligible for teacher licensure in Sport and Exercise Science.
