

Learning Assistant (LA) Job Description

Basic Function and Responsibilities

LAs are undergraduate students who serve as peer instructors in the classroom to support student learning, primarily via facilitating group work, and classroom community.

- LAs will plan to spend 5 hours per week on their position, which includes the following:
 - LA-Student Interactions in the Classroom
 - Attend all class meetings of the selected course and support student learning via facilitating group work.
 - Spend time to individually prepare for student interactions
 - Weekly Preparation Meetings with Instructional Team
 - Meet weekly with the course instructor and potentially fellow LAs and course TAs to reflect on past classes, plan for future classes, and consider how to support students.
- LA Pedagogy Course and Training
 - Enroll and participate in a 1-credit pedagogy course, in which you will consider effective ways to support students in the classroom. This course may count towards your degree as an upper-division or university elective and is scheduled to meet online from 3:35-4:25 pm on Mondays throughout the Spring semester.
- Professionalism
 - Respond promptly to communications from the LA Program and course instructor and initiate timely communications when needed.
 - Ensure that all university policies and procedures are followed.
 - Obtain complete knowledge of, and adhere to, the information, policies, and procedures presented in the employee handbook(s)
 - Maintain familiarity with the University of Northern Colorado missions.
 - Demonstrate professionalism when representing the University of Northern Colorado and the LA Program

Minimum Qualifications

- Have completed and earned a passing grade (C or above) in the course for which you may serve as an LA.
- Possess a course schedule that will allow the applicant to (1) attend the course in which they LA and (2) enroll in and participate in a 1-credit pedagogy course held online Mondays 3:35-4:25 pm during Spring 2024. The course could count as an upper-division or university elective.
- Possess strong interpersonal communication skills and a desire to assist fellow students.
- Be reliable, responsible, and able to deliver quality service with a positive attitude.
- Display ethical behavior and commitment to the Division of Student Academic Success and to the University of Northern Colorado.
- Display an openness and respect for persons from culturally diverse backgrounds.
