#### 1) Call To Order

# 2) Report on Budget by Sr. VP Randal Haack

Randy discussed with the group the process for the FY09 Budget Development, hand outs included the timeline, budget assumptions and a flow chart showing the process (these documents are attached). He discussed how the Academic Plan is being used to show institutional priorities for the campus for use in budget planning. Areas will be submitting their budgets to the VP's and President by February 15. Scott Schuttenberg and Michele Tyson, PASC co-chairs, will be a part of the Budget Advisory Group who will meet on March 14 & March 24 to discuss the budget. Campus Budget Brown Bags will be held monthly during this process to keep the campus informed. ## 3) Treasurer's Report (Dinges)

The Foundation account balance is \$2,990.20 as of December 31, 2007. This includes August – November 2007 employee contributions and it includes \$124.83 from the anonymous match (as of September 30, 2007). The matching contributions from October – December have not yet been calculated.

PASC contributed \$600 to the SPEEC/PASC event last year.
