 - Reasons for focusing on integrated recruitment and marketing
 - Changing Higher Education Landscape:
 - o Fewer high school graduates nationwide
 - Competition from more institutions (48 college/universities in Colorado alone)
 - Much criticism surrounding cost versus value
 - Permanently changed funding model
 - a. State share versus family share has shifted completely from 1991-2014
 - b. 66% of UNC's revenue is from student tuition
 - c. 22% from Colorado legislature
 - d. 12% other (grants, indirect funds, etc)
 - Five Year Sustainability Plan
 - Targeting enrollment at 15,000 for the 2018-19 AY
 - Target increase in graduate enrollment: 20% to 25%
 - Diversifying revenue streams
 - Increase number of community college transfer students
 - Increase number of International students
 - Target adult degree completers
 - a. Significant percentage of adults in CO have 75+ completed credits but no degree
 - Increase Dual Degree Programs
 - Increase number of professional, high-quality Master's degrees
 - More summer semester options
 - More delivery options (face to face, online and hybrid)
 - UNC has created a Recruiting & Marketing Team to work on above goals
 - To ensure all marketing efforts are seamlessly connected
 - Provides a single University perspective
 - Goals of Team
 - Who Are We?
 - Unique doctoral research university
 - o Faculty focus on both research and teaching rather than one or the other
 - UNC doesn't have Researcher OR Scholars
 - UNC has Teacher Scholars

- a. Faculty who not only do the research but teach their findings in the classrooms
- b. Faculty are experts in their fields
- c. Students have a unique experience wherein they connect with faculty in both the classroom and in the field
- Why does this matter?
 - More interaction for students with faculty outside of the classroom enriches the college experience
 - Students are able to customize their educational experience
