GEOG 300, GEOG 325 and GEOG 395 may be taken for credit more than once, under different titles. GEOG 422 and GEOG 492 may be taken for credit more than once, but only 3 hours count toward the major.

Additional Geography courses may be taken as University-wide electives. Consult with your advisor regarding options and opportunities for enhancing your Geography experience. Students may take 3 of the above hours in related electives from outside the program; consult with your advisor.
