This suggested schedule assumes that a student will begin with intermediate level Japanese. This worksheet is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

Notes

1. All work to be counted toward the degree must be beyond the first year level.
2. Unless otherwise noted, all courses with a JAPN prefix are conducted in Japanese.
3. Students must demonstrate competency in certain areas of language activity: oral or written proficiency in foreign language, ability to apply one's knowledge of the culture to appropriate situations in a foreign language environment.
4. To graduate with a Foreign Language degree, students must have a 2.5 GPA in those courses that count toward the major and were taken at UNC.
5. Opportunity for study abroad junior year.
6. All PTEP courses require an on-line application one semester in advance www.unco.edu/teach
7. In order to obtain approval for a student teaching assignment, an Asian Studies major must have obtained a grade of 3.0 or better in FL 440 and FL 341, completed the JAPN 422 Teaching and Learning Practicum, passed the PRAXIS or PLACE exam, and have successfully passed the official ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) with a rating of Advanced-Low or above.

Completion of the Japanese teaching major prepares the student for State of Colorado Licensure to teach in elementary and secondary schools.

The Japanese K-12 Teaching Major stresses communicative language learning that recognizes language acquisition as a dynamic process of discovery in which students develop the ability to use the Japanese language for specific communication purposes. This skill-using approach is obtained through content-based instruction at all levels and is complemented by authentic audio visual and textual materials.
