## **BS Recreation, Tourism, & Hospitality: Tourism & Hospitality Concentration (cont)**

This worksheet is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

### **Notes**

- <sup>1</sup>Students complete a three credit Practicum experience and a minimum 9-credit Internship experience. Current Advanced First Aid and CPR are prerequisites for these experiences, as are specified hours of practical experience (90 clock hours for the practicum and 480 clock hours for the internship). Students are approved for their practicum and their internship by faculty.
- <sup>2</sup>Students must have completed all required courses in the major and have a minimum GPA of 2.5 in major course before beginning their internship.
- Any grades of "D" or "F" in the Recreation, Tourism and Hospitality major must be repeated.

The Recreation, Tourism and Hospitality program is designed to provide the student with leadership and middle management skills through instruction of core concepts, theories, and best practices in a variety of employment settings.

The Tourism and Hospitality Concentration prepares students for careers in tourism and hospitality including the fields of event management, food services, lodging services, resort services, and destination marketing organizations.
