Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor’s degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 31 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Curriculum; meet all degree requirements in the student’s major field of study. Each major and/or concentration may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

Notes – Not every course is offered every year; specific courses of interest should be taken at your earliest convenience. Majors must take a minimum of 9 semester hours of regional geography credits and human geography credits. GEOG 300, GEOG 325 and GEOG 395 may be taken for credit more than once, under different titles. GEOG 422 and GEOG 492 may be taken for credit more than once, but only 3 credits count toward the major.

Additional Geography courses may be taken as University-wide electives. Consult with your advisor regarding options and opportunities for enhancing your Geography experience. Students may take 3 of the above hours in related electives from outside the program; consult with your advisor.
