This four-year plan is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

Program Admission Requirements –

A separate application (sophomore year) and acceptance to the clinical nursing program is required (see current Catalog).

Notes –

1. Students will be admitted on a staggered basis. One group will start in the summer session, the other group in the fall.
2. Liberal Arts Core requires a minimum of 40 credit hours; at least 31 credit hours of these shall be taken in areas 1 through 6.
3. Students should apply for graduation upon completion of their junior year.
4. A minimum grade of C or better (C- is not acceptable) or satisfactory in all nursing courses required for progression to the next semester must be earned.
