2-3-304(2) Emeritus Faculty. Tenured faculty members and/or administrators in good standing who have served at the University for ten years or more and who have attained the rank of professor or associate professor will automatically be nominated, at the time of retirement or at the time of Reduction in Force due to financial or program exigency, by the President to the BOT to become emeritus faculty. University faculty members and/or administrators in good standing who have served the University for a period fewer than ten years and who hold the rank of professor, associate professor, assistant professor or instructor, regardless of how long they have served, may at the time of retirement or at the time of Reduction in Force due to financial or program exigency, also be nominated for emeritus status. Such nominations may be made by the appropriate department chair/school director, the dean, CAO, or the President. Nominations, except those originating with the CAO or President, shall be submitted to the CAO, who will forward their recommendations to the President. The President may make such a recommendation to the BOT. The BOT shall take final action on all nominations.

Based on 2-3-304(2), I would like to nominate Dr. Nancy Glen for Emeritus. Dr. Nancy Glen retired as a contract renewable Associate Professor after serving 10 years at UNC. She holds a D.M. and was a great asset to the music education program. During her time at UNC, Dr. Glen:

- Maintained an active scholarly output with presentations and published articles in established music education journals. Even though her position here was a contract renewable faculty member, her scholarly output was comparable to that of a tenured faculty member.
- Stepped up and served as Research Advisor for several master's thesis and doctoral dissertations after a tenured faculty member left for another institution. She is still serving some students undergraduate faculty emeritus status.
- Was firmly committed to the undergraduate music education students and mentored most of the music education students during student teacher observations. Sometimes she observed as many as 14 students in one semester, multiple times per semester, throughout Northern Colorado and the Denver area.
- Was a valued member on several faculty search committees and served as the faculty representative and director for UNC's hand bell choir, comprised mostly of music education students.

Based on this rationale, I hope Dr. Glen's nomination for Emeritus Faculty in PVA will be successful.
