

Overview

This report summarizes Fall 2022 new student enrollment of First-Time First-Year (FTF) and Transfer (TRN) students. As classified by the state of Colorado, first-year is any student who has not enrolled in any postsecondary coursework after completion of their time in high school. A transfer student refers to any student entering for the first time known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level (e.g. undergraduate) after high school graduation (or passing an equivalency exam). The student may transfer with or without credit.

The number of new undergraduate students (FTF & TRN) declined 6.1% (see Table 1). Conversely, for the first-time in five years yield percentage increased (% of admits who enroll) for both FTF & TRN. Despite a 25%+ decline in both transfer applicants and admits, the impact on enrollment was minimized with a 9% increase transfer yield percentage (50.1% as compared to 41.1%, see table 2). Enrollment of new international transfer students more than doubled from 9 students reported in 2021 to 35 students reported in 2022 (Table 3).



Academic Profile: First-Time First-Year Students

Fall 2022 was the first year following the state of Colorado's removing test score requirements for first-time students applying to select four-year public universities. The result of test-optional admissions at UNC shows ACT and SAT scores of incoming students increased slightly and the incoming student GPAs remain steady (Table 5). The percent of first-time students entering UNC with college credit increased to its highest rate in four years (Table 6). The top 10 feeder counties for first-time resident students remained unchanged and there was a 20% increase in the number of students enrolled from Weld County (Table 7).

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Academic Profile: Transfer Students

The cumulative GPA average for new transfer students increased slightly for the mean, median and middle 50% (Table 8). The top ten feeder institutions for transfer students remained consistent. Four of the top ten feeder schools are four-year degree granting institutions, and, more transfer students enroll from AIMS Community College than any other institution (Table 9).
