

- UG Gross Tuition & Fee Revenue for FY21 is projected to be \$86.5 million
  - 78% will be from Tuition, as shown above
  - 18% = Mandatory Fees
  - 2% = Program-specific differential tuition
  - 2% = Academic Fees
  - 26% of that revenue will be covered by institutional aid (discount)

#### **Differential Tuition**

#### Why is UNC charging a differential for these classes?

Differential tuition is one element in a university strategic pricing plan designed to enhance UNC academic program quality and student support services. Sciences/SES/Art, Business, Nursing, Music, Theatre and Dance programs all share three traits; they are high quality programs that also face higher demand and higher costs than many UNC programs. The money generated by differential tuition will help maintain quality in these programs and at UNC.

#### **Academic Fees**

- **1. Course Fees:** costs of consumable supplies/equipment for a laboratory or classroom
- **2. Supervision Fees:** faculty travel and related expenses for clinical rotations and student teaching
- 3. Participation Fees: pass-thru costs for tickets, admission, travel, etc.
- **4. Assessment Fees:** pass-thru costs for tests, evaluations, and assessments including safety and skills performance
- 5. Program Fees: incremental costs for specific programs (e.g. NHS, PVA)
- 6. Private Lesson Fees: individual music lessons
