Any verbal or physical display that does not uphold these values during Homecoming Spirit Week could result in disqualification from the day's events and referred to the Dean of Students' Office for further action.
- Disqualification from any event will result in team notification and forfeiture of points.
 - All decisions made by the Office of Student Life, the University Program Council, and the Homecoming Week Committee are final.
- Participant registration during Homecoming Spirit Week events gives consent for the University of Northern Colorado to use photos for promotional and/or identification purposes.

Residence Hall Groups & Student Clubs / Orgs!

Your group requires at least FIVE (5) people on a team and must be enrolled in UNC courses.

Fraternity and Sorority Groups!

Your group requires at least TEN (10) people on a team and must be enrolled in UNC courses. Any questions can be directed to the Program Coordinator for Fraternity and Sorority Life.



Competition v. Non-Competition

Competitions: Competition events <u>will</u> have 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place opportunities for points. Only one of the competition events also has attendance based points (Bear Sync).

Non-Competitions: Non-Competition events <u>will not</u> have 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place opportunities for points. However, they will have point opportunities for groups that have 50% or more of their team present, and the team with the most people at these and Competition events will also have opportunities for Bonus Points.

Monday: Points will be awarded for... attendance.

Tuesday: Points will be awarded for... 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

Wednesday: Points will be awarded for... attendance.

Thursday: Points will be awarded for... 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, as well as attendance.

Friday: Points will be awarded for... attendance.

Saturday: Points will be awarded for... 1st, 2nd, and 3rd



Each event will be scored differently (see rubrics below.) Once the team's score has been determined for the event from its specific rubric, there will be a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for each event. For example, if you were to get 105 points for Build for Bear Pantry (as determined by its specific rubric), and you had the highest number of points out of everyone for the Build for Bear Pantry event, you would be 1st place for the Build for Bear Pantry event, awarding you 20 points.

The points for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd are as follows:

1st Place: 20 Points

2nd Place: 15 Points

3rd Place: 10 Points

50% or More Team Member Attendance: 10 Points

Highest Percent of Team Members Present Out of All Teams (# of people present divided by #of people total on team): 5 Points

Build for Bear Pantry Guidelines

- Each team must purchase or collect their own can-good to build the sculpture. (Food can NOT be collected from Bears Pantry or other local food banks. This would result in disqualification.)
- 2. Cans and/or boxes must be nonperishable food items.
- 3. Structure must be comprised of food in the form of cans or boxes (different point values listed below).
- 4. Food cannot be damaged in the process of building the structure. If damaged, the point value from the item will be removed from the total score.
- 5. Structure size may not exceed 10'x10'x10'.
- 6. Each team has 3.5 hours (between 11:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.) to build their structure.
- 7. No props may be used.
- 8. No gluing, welding, or other permanent affixing of cans allowed. Any type of tape is permissible (must be able to be easily removed).
- 9. No opened food, glass, or alcohol allowed.
- 10. Follow safety precautions when building your structure.

Point System

One can-good item will be worth either 1 point, 3 points, or 5 points (as determined by items most needed by Bear Pantry):



• 5 points:


- Canned meat (chicken, tuna, spam, etc.)
- Whole meals (Chef Boyardee, beef stew, etc.)
- Soup with meat

3 points:

- Soup without meat
- o Pasta (mac & cheese, etc.)
- Peanut butter, almond butter, etc.

• 1 point:

- Fruits and vegetables
- Cereal
- Oatmeal
- Other boxed items



Can Counting will occur from **11:00** a.m. - **11:30** a.m. Building will start at **11:30** a.m. and go until **3:00** p.m. Cans/boxes in your team's square at McKee Breezeway will be counted by judges at 11:00 a.m. Please separate your cans based on worth (see above) to make the process go faster. Any cans that are added during the building process must be brought to a judge to count. Teams that are not present at 11:00 a.m. must check in with judges upon arrival to have items counted.

After the allotted building time frame has ended (3:00 p.m.), the judges will rate the structure according to the four categories (creativity/originality, relation to Homecoming theme, quality of design, and completion) for additional points ranging from 0-50 (see rubric). After the final points are determined, there will be a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winner that will follow the normal point system (1st place= 20 points, 2nd place= 15 points, 3rd place= 10 points).

Bear Sync

- 1. Music must be turned in as a digital file by **Monday, October 1st @ 11:59 p.m**. (emailed to sydney.crutchfield@unco.edu)
- 2. Music for performances must be pre-approved by the Homecoming Week Committee.

 You will be notified immediately if there is a concern with your selection.
- 3. Bear Sync routines should be MAXIMUM 3 minutes long
- 4. Fraternities & Sororities: Must have at least 10 people on stage at all times.
- 5. Residence Halls & Student Clubs / Orgs: Must have at least 5 people on stage at all times.
- 6. All members must be clothed at all times (swim suits not allowed).
- 7. All Team Members on stage MUST be actively participating.
- 8. Confetti, Glitter, Silly String, and other small "hard to clean" items **are not allowed**.

 Please no use of liquids or any materials that would be deemed to "make a mess."
- 9. Judging Criteria includes: talent, costuming, entertainment value, and relevancy towards Homecoming Theme (See Rubric Below).

Spirit Board

- 1. Each team must have a 2' x 4' plywood board (see page 16: "How to make a Spirit Board.")
- 2. Boards must be decorated with tissue paper to represent the Homecoming theme Bear-Foot

in the Sand (see page 16: "How to Make a Spirit Board.")

How To: Make a Spirit Board

Spirit Boards represent your Fraternity / Sorority Group, Residence Hall Group, or Student Club / Org. Group. The creativity that goes into the boards are for your group to decide but we do encourage you to keep in mind the spirit of a UNC Bear and the Homecoming 2018 theme: Bear-Foot in the Sand.

Date: Saturday, October 6th 10:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m. (Boards must be **completed by 10:00 a.m.)**

Set Up Time: Please set up by 10:15 a.m. at the latest. UPC will arrive **no earlier** than 10:00 a.m.

Set Up Location: Nottingham Field/Adjacent Parking Lot (More Info TBD)

Tear Down Time: Please pick up your Spirit Board no later than 12:00 p.m.

What You'll Need:

- 1. OSB Sheathing Board (see below)
- 2. Elmer's or Hot Glue
- 3. Tissue Paper (colored to match your desired picture)



Board Requirements: We are requiring you to use 2' x 4' OSB Sheathing, 7/16 inches thick. These boards are available at **Home Depot for less than \$9.99**.

Step One: Purchase your Board!

• Your board must be a 2' x 4' OSB Sheathing Board, 7/16 inches thick.

Step Two: Create a Picture!

- Draw the envisioned picture of your Spirit Board. Remember that your picture should depict the theme for Homecoming 2018: Bear-Foot in the Sand. Please create your picture so that your board is vertical, not horizontal. We will not be able to display your board if your design is horizontal with the 4' side as a base.
- Designate which color goes to which piece of the picture, and label that on your drawing.
- Make an outline on your plywood that will act as a color and shape guide as you fill the picture with tissue paper.



Step Three: Create your Board!

(This part is tedious and demands many hands, so be sure to leave plenty of time and people to get this done!)



- Rip the tissue paper into sticky-note-sized sections (remember to match the color with the drawing).
- Cover a part of the tissue paper with glue, and place the tissue paper in the designated spot in the picture.
- Continue this process until you have successfully created your final Spirit Board picture!





Note: Pictures above are not to measurement. Spirit Boards for 2018 will be smaller. (Review Measurements).

Final Reminders!

Participants that are registered for Homecoming Spirit Week will be judged on their Spirit Board display as part of the final week's score.

Note: Only the registered teams of Spirit Week are allowed a spot for Spirit Board display.
